BOARD MEETING

Tuesday, August 24 at 7:00 PM in the South Fairlington Community Center. All homeowners and renters are welcome. To place an item on the agenda, please call David Pollard, facilities manager, at least ten days in advance.

POOL HOURS

June 22 - Labor Day: 10:30 AM - 9:00 PM daily.

Adult Swim (age 17 and up only): 8:00 - 9:00 PM weekdays.

Pool Committee Co-chairs: Lorrie Dillree (820-0642) and Tom Whittaker (578-3061).

GENERAL INFO

Trash Pickup: Monday - Saturday except Federal holidays. Put securely tied bags out between 7:00 and 8:00 AM on the day of the pickup.

Large Items: Call David Pollard to arrange for pickup.

Recycling: Receptacles for mixed glass, plastics (*HDPE 1 & 2 only*), and cans (aluminum and steel) are put out on Tuesdays and collected on Wednesdays. Newspapers (securely tied or bagged in paper, not plastic) and broken down corrugated cardboard may be left beside the receptacles.

Mixed paper (junk mail, office paper, envelopes, etc.), catalogs, and magazines are accepted at the Arlington Country Recycling Center, Four Mile Run at Columbia Pike.

PARKING STICKER PROGRAM GOES INTO EFFECT

In order to better control parking, the Board has decided to implement a numbered parking sticker system, similar to that used in North Fairlington. Arbor residents will receive one sticker per unit (to reflect one parking space per unit). Stickers will be static cling so that they can easily be moved to another car if desired.

As before, any car you authorize may park in your space, with or without a sticker, so it will not be necessary to move your sticker between cars unless you choose.

A list of sticker numbers matched to addresses will be on file with **A1 Towing** and with **David Pollard**. You will use your sticker number to identify yourself to A1 if you request that an interloper be towed from your space. There will no longer be any need to register and remember a password if you call A1.

If an unauthorized vehicle with a sticker is parked in your space, it will be your option to call David (*during business hours only*) for the name of the owner so that you can ask that the car be moved rather than having it towed.

Your sticker will be delivered through your door within the next two or three weeks. The first sticker will be free but there will be a \$10 charge to replace lost stickers.

DANGER FROM BROKEN GLASS

The maintenance crew has recently cleaned empty beer bottles from the Tot Lot and broken glass from the common area. The broken bottles were in the grass, where they could not easily be seen and were potentially very dangerous to children, adults, and pets. RECYCLING REMINDERS

NEWSPAPER. Please bundle and tie with string or else bag in paper (not plastic) bags. The Sunday supplements may be included but not the plastic wrappers.

PLASTICS. Only HDPE 1 and 2 may be recycled. Yogurt containers, for example, are usually not acceptable. Check the HDPE number on any plastic item. Please rinse milk and beverage containers and flatten them so that they take up less space.

METALS. Steel and aluminum cans are acceptable. Please rinse before placing in the bins.
